

Ride for Freedom marks its 26th year

There is no better name for an event that resonates with patriotism, deep loyalty, sacrifice, a sense of mission and authentic history: Rolling Thunder. Oh, yeah. Here they come. They're rolling, and it is thunderous.

For the 26th year, hundreds of thousands of motorcycle riders will glide into the nation's capital aboard perfectly tricked-out Harley-Davidsons, three-wheelers, newfangled racing bikes and old hogs — bound for the Ride for Freedom.

Last year, 750,000 riders were roaring their way from the Pentagon to hallowed acreage surrounding the Lincoln Memorial in homage to the U.S. military, not to mention chrome, mighty engines and old-school fossil fuel.

They hail from 90 chartered chapters, though all riders are welcome.

"Everything about this rally still affects me, no matter how many years we've been doing it. And everything we do is meant to remember and honor our POWs, MIAs and all of our veterans," said former U.S. Army Sgt. Artie Muller, who founded the

organization in 1987 and named it for a U.S. bombing campaign over North Vietnam more than two decades earlier.

"I lost a whole lot of guys in that war. I never forget that I made it back but they didn't," he said.

"It's hard to predict how many will show up," said organizer and spokeswoman Nancy Regg. "We lose members each year, particularly our Vietnam vets. It can be hard on some of them. But we always draw at least 500,000 riders. Always. And all are

Something else, lingering and persistent, troubles Mr. Muller.

"It's what we call the 'live' issue. Are the men who were left behind after all past wars still alive? We recover the remains of those lost, which is an honorable thing. But little is being done to resolve what happened to those left behind alive," he said. "Sgt. Bowe R. Bergdahl, captured July 1, 2009, is still missing. What are we doing to get him home? Let's find him and the others including those missing soldiers from other countries."

"DEATH TAX": WHAT'S IN A NAME?

The proponents of estate tax abolition have a good thing going for them with the moniker "death tax." Language is essential to enlisting popular support. After President Reagan's missile defense program was dubbed "star wars," proponents had difficulty regaining control over the terms of the debate.

Defenders of the estate tax lost the battle of shibboleths early on. We knew we were in trouble in 2000, when major television news networks, **such as CNN**, abandoned objectivity, using "death tax" rather than estate tax in their news coverage.

The derivative of the "death tax" phrase is disputed. As it turns out, the phrase "death tax" has been around for several decades.

Congressman Christopher Cox (R-Calif.), lead sponsor of repeal, notes that there were many references to "death taxes" in professional tax journals dating back to the 1970s. President Reagan first used the term in a Minnesota speech in 1982

One significant player in advancing the "death tax" tag was **Jim Martin**, a longtime activist who founded **"60 Plus,"** a conservative Washington beltway alternative to the American Association of Retired Persons.

Martin has the distinction of having given **President George W. Bush** his first political job. When Bush was twenty-two years old, Martin hired him to work on the 1968 campaign in Florida to elect **Ed Gurney** to the **U.S. Senate**. The president, distinguished for his unique nicknames of friends and colleagues, calls Martin "**Buddha.**"


Gains Important Ally

Martin is credited with having brought the "death tax" coin back into wider circulation in 1993. He gained an ally in **political mastermind Frank Luntz**. Luntz, who conducted focus groups for conservative caucuses and politicians, understood the importance of language.

Luntz's message research found that "death tax" kindled voter resentment in a way that "inheritance tax" and "estate tax" didn't. Luntz shared his findings with Republican leaders and included the phrase in the GOP's 1994 "Contract with America."

In a strategy memo to GOP lawmakers, the media-savvy Luntz suggested that legislators stage press conferences opposing the estate tax "at your local mortuary" to dramatize the issue. "I believe this backdrop will clearly resonate with your constituents," advised Luntz. "Death is something the American people understand."

The first challenge of any campaign is to have a good message. But it is another hurdle, as the media spin masters will tell you, to enforce "message discipline" (i.e., getting everyone to say the same thing). Enter the pizza fund.

"Death tax pizza funds" first appeared at **Jim Martin's 60 Plus** organization. Then, across the Potomac, a pizza fund was instituted by Jack Faris, the president and CEO of the National Federation of Independent Businesses. Soon the idea spread to Capitol Hill, where then House Speaker Newt Gingrich and other pro-repeal lawmakers instated pizza funds in their offices.

Slowly the powerful "death tax" phrase worked itself out from these lobbying groups into advertising, talk shows, and into the title of legislation, the "Death Tax Elimination Act of 2000." A powerful message catapulted the repeal cause forward.

Other names by 60 Plus, Grave Robber's Tax; Grim Reaper's Tax; Exit or Departure Tax; Cruel Tax; Success Tax, Stiffest Tax of All; and **Voluntary Tax**, the latter Martin said is in honor of Gates, Buffett, Soros,, et al, since they say they don't mind paying it and since they think they know best where your aftertax assets should go. An outrageous tax? You be the judge. As **Professor Edward McCaffery**, an attorney at USC and a self-described "unrequited liberal" has said: "To most people, death seems like the wrong time to tax." Martin succinctly says: "The first claimant in line for your after-tax assets is **Uncle Sam, not even a blood relative!**"

A survey by 60 Plus shows **77% of the public**, across all income and philosophical categories, **favors total repeal**, citing the **"unfairness"** of the tax. To those who claim "death tax" repeal is a "tax cut for the rich," 60 Plus rebuts, "that horse is dead, dismount!" The rich have lawyers and accountants to set up foundations (ever heard of foundations headed by Gates, Buffett, Turner, Rockefeller)?

He also wants to know why the stark POW/MIA flag is not flown over the White House. "It was in previous administrations," Mr. Muller said.

He should know. With such allies as chanteuse Nancy Sinatra and others along for the ride, Mr. Muller was warmly welcomed in the White House for years. George W. Bush made a practice of greeting them in the grand driveway of the presidential residence. The group had a brief but cordial visit with President Obama last year.

Just don't get Mr. Muller started on health care, though. He is no fan of "Obamacare" and is particularly piqued over backlogs on disability claims, military budget cuts and increases in prescription costs for veterans. They are scheduled to rise from \$9 to \$36, he said.

"Why is that? Many vets can't even aff ord their medications now. It's a disgrace," Mr. Muller said.

He established Rolling Thunder Charities six years ago as an entity to tend to veterans and active-duty personnel who are under fi nancial or personal duress. Among the organization's major backers are Harley-Davidson and Aetna. Ninety-fi ve percent of the donations go directly to those in need, Mr. Muller said.

Though politics, policy and legislation

are never far from the Rolling Thunder radar, the group has a sense of place and occasion. On Friday evening, a candlelight vigil will be held at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. Saturday's events include a fi vehour program at the Lincoln Memorial, a wreath presentation at the United States Navy Memorial, traditional Scottish pipes and drums, and plenty of opportunities to salute Old Glory. The American fl ag is properly displayed virtually everywhere at these events.

Rep. Reid J. Ribble, Wisconsin Republican, and Rep. Jon Runyan, New Jersey Republican, are among the scheduled speakers.



Volunteers keep the Rolling Thunder riders fed and fueled

DENVER | Before they arrive in Washington, D.C., the bikers of Rolling Thunder drive through hundreds of small towns, where they can count on receiving a hand from friends like Gary Komassa.

The president of the New Mexico Rolling Thunder chapter has never attended the national event. Instead, he helps run the stop in Las Cruces, N.M., a way station on the southern route of what's known as the "Run for the Wall."

Hundreds of bikers stopped May 16 in Las Cruces, and Mr. Komassa and other volunteers were there to help them with everything from finding a hot meal to filling their tanks with gas.

"We greeted them, fed them, put them up," said Mr. Komassa. "We direct them to their motels and hotels, help them with

any issues. We get about 200 to 400 coming through. It's a lot of bikes."

This year marks the 25th anniversary of the Run for the Wall, which begins in Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., and then splits into two routes: the southern route and the central route. Along the way, thousands of bikers join the Rolling Thunder brigade as it makes its way to Washington, D.C. In addition to a national expression of patriotism and pride in the military, the annual event is a major logistical challenge as well.

There are nine stops on both routes, and hundreds of volunteers to assist the riders as they make their way cross-country, said Rolling Thunder national spokeswoman Nancy Regg.

Edward Coty, a Washington Post Foreign Service writer wrote an article on January 27, 1992, page A10 about a "miracle well" in Tlacote, Mexico. His article began: "By the thousands they waited; men, women and children, equipped with plastic jerrycans and tranquil faith in miracles that has adorned Mexican history since pre-Hispanic times.

"The line stretched alongside a dusty road for more than a quarter of a mile one day last week. On other days it strung out for more than a mile as hundreds of thousands of sick and lame line up for the "light water" in Jesus Chahin's well—the miracle water that is said to cure everything from AIDS and cancer to obesity or high cholesterol.

"For me, all of these things are God's miracles," said Mary Guadalupe Aguilar, a Dominican nun who drove 175 miles from Puebla along with a fellow nun and a priest, Father Juan Crespo, who has prostate cancer.

"Chahin, a wealthy rancher, has been making the water available free to the public since May, 1991 ever since he accidentally discovered its healthy properties by observing the swift recovery of a farm dog who had lapped some of it. But Chahin quickly dismissed the reporters continued reference to "miracle water," by explaining he was using distillers purchased from Crystal Clear in the United States, and the "curative power" comes from the constant movement of water from one metal tank (the distillers) to another. Meyers was a deliberately obscure inventor who equipped his dune buggy with a HHO fuel system and ran it on nothing but tap water for three years.

As Meyers continued to defend his statements of generating 300% more energy than the electricity consumed to create it, scientists continued to refute his claims by saying an over-unity device was impossible. To prove he was correct, Meyers subjected his patents to three years of rigorous testing by the US Patent Office, proving beyond a shadow of a doubt that his HHO invention really worked. The one problem with Meyers' work is that because he constantly feared someone would steal it, he cloaked his discoveries and methods in obscure terminology that he simply made up to protect his work. He used that created terminology in his patent applications, keeping his code secret. Meyers' Water Fuel Cell, a variation of which is now being used by Davies and everyone else experimenting with HHO, was subjected to three years of testing by the Patent Office and Meyers claims have been substantiated.

Davies had one problem with his invention—he couldn't achieve the 300-to-1 ratio Meyers claimed in his notes. In Meyers' notes, Davies observed the question Meyers asked himself: "How do we switch off the covalent bond of the water molecule, and do it economically?" He answered himself: "We need a way to switch off the bonds and not process the water molecule in any way. Normally the oxygen atom has 8 protons and 8 electrons.

But when the oxygen atom accepts the negatively charged hydrogen electron there is an electrical imbalance. The oxygen atom still has 8 protons, but because of the hydrogen atoms, it has 10 electrons. Meyers realized that because there is no electromagnetic field between hydrogen and oxygen, all he had to do was reverse the electrolysis process. Under Newton's second law, all Meyers had to do was set up opposite electrical charges to make the positive field attract the negative charge. The positive field, according to Coulombs Law, would repel the positive charge and the positive field would then attract the negative charge. When Meyers' patent clerk realized Meyers was describing a form of cold fusion in his patent application, he said: "Why in the world did no one ever think of this?" I think someone did. His name was Michael Faraday.

Faraday may have theorized cold fusion in the early 1800s, long before the technology to achieve it existed. Meyers may have achieved the concept in 1997, but David Davies wasn't getting the results he wanted.

On April 23, 2013 John EllisTM received a fax from David Davies concerning what the as many as 10,000 pilgrims a day carrying their jerrycans to Jesus Chahin's well called "miracle water." Davies needs some "exceptional" water. In his fax, Davies said:

"I've been researching and building hydrogen generators for big trucks since 2007. So, when a friend of mine sent me a copy of the John EllisTM water advertisement from a magazine I went ahead and requested a free sample of John EllisTM water to test with my new HHO (hydrogen-hydrogen-oxygen) cell design.

"After mixing KOH and well water for the electrolyte, I connected my cell to my Pulse Width Modulator that pulses energy from a 12-volt battery. As suspected, the amps shot up to over 35 amps blowing a few 30 amp fuses. So, I added two cups of hydrogen peroxide to dilute the electrolyte. "The cell had excellent HHO output and the amperage immediately dropped a little bit down to 29 to 30 amp range where it remained. 



Vietnam vet embraces Rolling Thunder's mission

For Vietnam veteran and professional photographer Patrick Hughes, the self-portrait he would have shot back in 1993 would not have been a particularly cheerful one.

It was a time when he nearly lost his job at a large daily newspaper, in part, he said, because of his military service. From that point on, he was determined to disassociate himself from the military and avoid speaking about his Marine experience for his family's sake.

But then he learned about a nonprofit advocacy organization serving veterans and active-duty service personnel. Curious, he volunteered that year to help out Rolling Thunder as a photographer chronicling its annual Washington Memorial Day event. Twenty years later, Mr. Hughes is an active Rolling Thunder national member and will be out on the streets of Washington once again this weekend, camera in hand, promoting the event and in particular, the campaign to keep alive the memory of American prisoners of war.

"The first year I went, I kind of stayed in the background but took a lot of pictures and met some people and thought, 'This

"I lost some of my best friends in Vietnam. And I know there were people who were left behind, even though our government said something different."

This Memorial Day weekend, Mr. Hughes will be one of the hundreds of thousands of people who flock to the nation's capital to be a part of Rolling Thunder's 26th annual "Ride for Freedom."

Rolling Thunder, dedicated in part to bringing awareness to POW/MIA issues, is run by volunteers who stand by their slogan, "We will not forget." Mr. Hughes has actively campaigned to bring home Sgt. Bowe R. Bergdahl, a POW who has been missing in Afghanistan since June 30, 2009. In March, on Sgt. Bergdahl's 27th birthday, Mr. Hughes and several other veterans stood outside a Fox News television station in Philadelphia with a table and a birthday cake for him. The inscription on the cake: "Another unhappy birthday for Sgt. Bowe Bergdahl."

"I have met his mom and dad and stayed

was what I wanted to do," Mr. Hughes said. in touch with his dad. So I really feel like I almost know their son, because of my relationship with the father of the family," Mr. Hughes said.

> He noted that the remains of POWs from other wars have been returned to their families.

> "Years of waiting and hope and finally, despair, but at least they got the remains back," he said. "Hopefully, some day we can bring back a living POW."

> The ride provides an environment of camaraderie for the gathered veterans and supporters, something Mr. Hughes said he badly needed when he first attended the event in 20 years ago. During his first Rolling Thunder, he met and forged a bond with several Australian Vietnam veterans, who have since passed away.

> "I never thought I would go to Australia," he said. "But I went there three times since I met them."

> Mr. Hughes, whose studio is in Glen Mills, Pa., near Philadelphia, is also committed to drawing the attention of

American citizens, not just politicians, to the POW-MIA issue. He has flag poles on his property displaying the American, POW and Marine Corps flags. He has placed POW ads in his community publications, distributed free writing pads with the POW logo and encouraged neighbors to display the Stars and Stripes on Memorial Day weekends.

"In subtle ways, I try to educate people or enlighten them," he said. "In a nice way, it's not 'in your face.' I occasionally do ask and I try not to hard sell. I just let them know what's going on."

Mr. Hughes said he met President Obama once and asked him if he was familiar with Sgt. Bergdahl's plight. The president confirmed the sergeant was alive and remained a priority, according to Mr. Hughes.

"I'm hoping to meet him again and ask him why it's taken so long to get Bowe back, when they've gotten back three hikers in Iran and sent Navy SEALs to get [American aid worker Jessica Buchanan] from Africa" in 2012, he said. "These are civilians and that's fine. But why can't you get back somebody who raised his hand to serve his country, [especially if] they know where he is. Why can't they get him back?"

POW/MIA issues remain as a priority

For Tom Bender, fi ghting for his fellow veterans means more than showing up once a year in Washington for an awe-inspiring motorcycle rally.

The Vietnam combat veteran and head of Rolling Thunder Inc.'s government affairs team has taken the lead on lobbying Congress to improve health care benefits for members of the military and has spearheaded a number of other legislative priorities on behalf of his fellow vets.

Those e! orts attract plenty of attention, but it's what Mr. Bender does behind the scenes — far away from the roar of a half-million motorcycles in the center of the nation's capital — that he feels makes perhaps the greatest di! erence.

"It's tragic, but I've grown accustomed to it. I understand what obstacles they'll run into. I can help them navigate the system," Mr. Bender said Monday, as he sat in Veterans A! airs Secretary Eric K. Shinseki

the waiting room of a New Jersey VA hospital. He had driven a fellow Vietnam veteran to the medical center earlier that morning, a duty he tackles regularly but one that, admittedly, can be emotionally taxing.

He takes those experiences and the often heart-wrenching sto-

ries of fellow veterans with him to Capitol Hill, where he continues to push Rolling Thunder's broad legislative agenda.

The organization, gathering in D.C. this Memorial Day weekend for its 26th annual motorcycle rally, is best known for its work on POW/MIA issues. It took the lead in getting a bill passed in 1993 that kept the federal government from declaring a member of the military dead unless there is concrete proof.

The organization also helped push through legislation requiring government buildings to fl y the black POW/MIA fl ag to address the Rolling Thunder crowd. Rep. with the words "You are not forgotten."

One of its most recent successes was the "Respect for America's Fallen Heroes Act," which was signed by President George W. Bush in 2006 and keeps protesters 300 feet from the entrance of any cemetery hosting a military funeral.

Rolling Thunder is now fi ghting for the creation of a congressional select

committee to "conduct a full investigation of all unresolved matters relating to any United States POW/MIAs unaccounted for" from any past conflicts. The group's website features the case of Sgt. Bowe Bergdahl, the Army sergeant captured by the Taliban in June 2009 who is believed to be the only living American serviceman being held in the Afghanistan conflict. The select committee idea has attracted a number of co-sponsors but has yet to make it to the House floor.

"It's a matter of priorities," Mr. Bender said, adding that despite the ongoing e! orts of Rolling Thunder, the POW/MIA issue still isn't given the attention it deserves among lawmakers.

Rolling Thunder also continues its ongoing e! ort to speed up the processing of medical and benefits by the Department of Veterans A! airs, pointing to the nearly 1 million outstanding claims still in the system.

is facing increasing heat from lawmakers and some veterans groups as the backlog persists with an infl ux of new veterans from the conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan.

Moving forward, Mr. Bender and his colleagues also are pushing a number of bills to provide benefits for

Vietnam veterans a! ected by Agent Orange and are seeking co-sponsors in Congress.

With Rolling Thunder's credibility and — this weekend — visibility on those and other issues, and given the sheer size of its annual bike rally, members of Congress can't help but pay attention.

"Groups like Rolling Thunder help keep [veterans' issues] in the front of the mind of members of Congress like myself," said Rep. Reid J. Ribble, Wisconsin Republican and one of two members of Congress scheduled Jon Runyan, New Jersey Republican, also will speak, organizers of the event said.

But legislative e! orts are only a part of the organization's mission. As Mr. Bender and others fi ght on the legislative front, Rolling Thunder's local chapters care for veterans in ways that too often go unnoticed.

pitch tents on their front yards, they have Little League games — it's amazing."

And who knows? Maybe next year Mr. Komassa will be one of those riding in the convoy instead of greeting it.


"I haven't made it yet," he said, "but I would love to go."




